The John Fisher School Sixth Form Results 2024

We are delighted to share news of our 2024 Sixth Form results, and to pay tribute to our Sixth Form leavers, many of whom have excelled. Among several outstanding performances, we would like to mention Rodrigo who secured A*A*A* in Mathematics, Further Mathematics, Chemistry and Physics. Rodrigo, who will take up a place at Cambridge to study Natural Sciences, was one of ten students who all achieved at least three grades at A/A*. Taking account of all qualifications, twenty-five students were awarded the equivalent UCAS points of grade A in three subjects. University destinations include the Universities of Bath, Bristol, Cambridge, Durham, Imperial, KCL, QMUL, Southampton, Sussex, Warwick and York.
