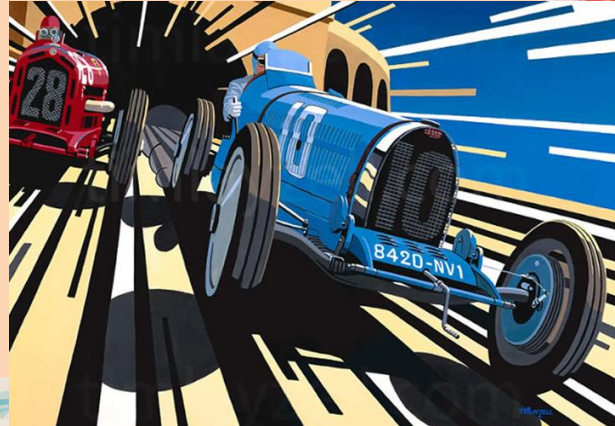

Independent Artist Research Project

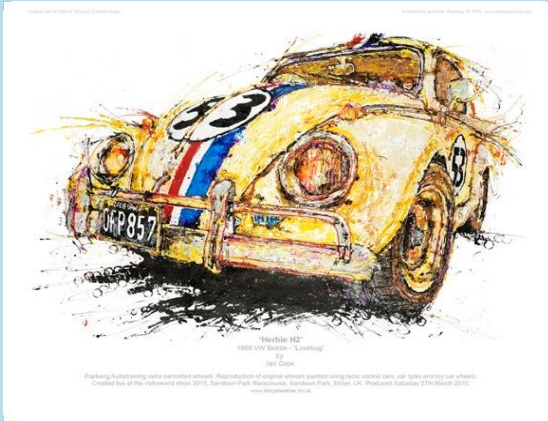


- In this independent project, you will **research**, **analyse** and **respond** to artwork.

Task 2:

Write an analysis of your chosen artwork.
Use the Describe, Analyse, Interpret and Judge framework.



You will have done something like this in class

Describe

When you describe an artwork, identify things in the work that you can see, name, and describe. Think of it as if you were trying to describe the work to a blind person

Analyse

When you analyze an artwork you will tell how the subject matter and elements of the work have been organized. To do this, think of the elements of art — line, shape, form, and colour.

Task 3:

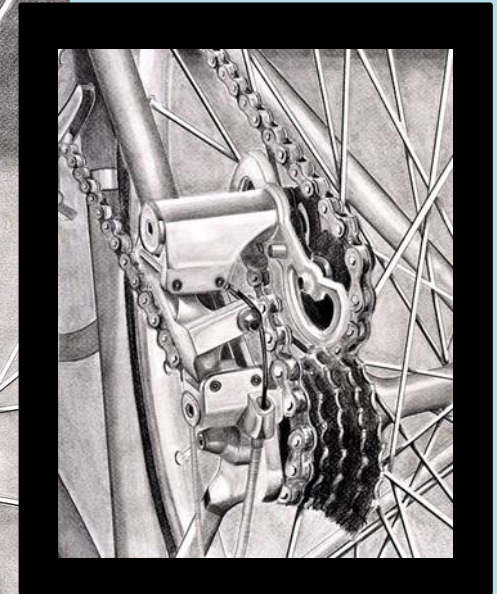
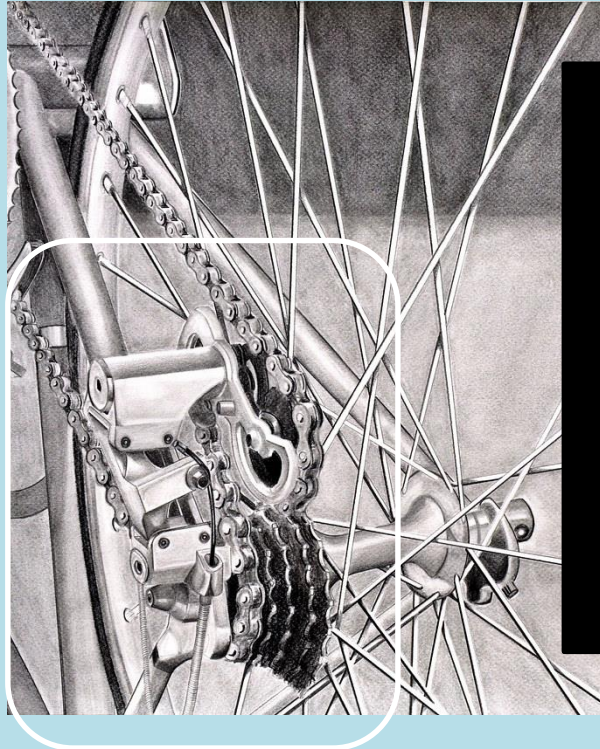
Creating a Cropped Image.

Successful architecture has to pay attention to how it sits and interacts with it's surroundings, it's "**context**".



Your task –

- To create an **observational drawing** of part of a bicycle, concentrating carefully drawing the components to **scale** and using **tonal range shading** to add realism and depth.
- This can be from a photograph/ image or from an actual bicycle.
- This is to be completed in pencil.
